Group Issues

In no particular order:-

- The meeting at St Anthony's, Liverpool would like support and information from the Parents and Carers committee. The GSR spoke to the new P&C chair.
- The Sunday night Liverpool group is holding a New Years Eve Dance and would like any profits to go to the European Convention. It will attend the European Fundraising and Entertainments Committee to ask for start-up money.
- The Tuesday night Chorlton meeting expressed disappointment with the lack of support it has received from the P&C committee regarding funding. It also asked the PI committee to tell professionals in the area about the childcare at the meeting.
- A new meeting has started in Hulme on Fridays. A starter pack was given.
- There is also a new meeting started in Barrow in Furness. A starter pack was given.
- The Monday morning Blackburn meeting asked for money to pay for flyers giving details about their meeting. They were referred to the PI committee. It was pointed out that the ASC cannot give money to struggling meetings and that it was up to group members to find any solutions.
- The group at Green Lane, Blackburn asked for £87.60 for literature for addicts. They will liaise with H&I.

PROPOSAL from Liverpool Tuesday Women's Group

The following points were made during the discussion of the proposal:

It was said that there are differences in the needs of various sections of the addict population and NA should try to get to all addicts.

Website Report

There is no webservant at present, although Bill is looking after it at a very basic level. We have a service forum under test at present. www.nwna.info/forum

Our website was taken down and the database corrupted, as where many others in late June. We have repaired this, but lost some information updates along the way. Propose we develop our site to protect us better for this.

We are planning to create a downloadable/printable where to find that is linked directly to our meetings database. At present these are two separate jobs, and make for keeping either of them up to date very difficult. This can be improved.

If the member fails to attend for a third time then a **VOTE OF NO CONFIDENCE** is proposed. This vote is a policy decision.”
